Eagle Bluff Acquisition Campaign

To secure permanent public access and long-term conservation of Eagle Bluff in Central Maine for future generations of climbers, hikers, and outdoor enthusiasts to enjoy in its current and natural state.

Adirondack Mountain Club, Albany NY \$30,000



Responsible Recreation Campaign

To protect 379,705 acres of Wild Forest in New York from unregulated all-terrain vehicle use and abuse.

Alaska Wilderness League, Washington DC \$35,000



Arctic National Wildlife Refuge Management Plan Project

To secure a management plan for the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge that recommends Wilderness protection for the Refuge's Coastal Plain.

American Rivers, Washington, DC \$35,000



Wild Rivers of the North Cascades Campaign

To protect 150 river miles and nearly 50,000 acres of riverside lands in Washington's North Cascades through federal legislation and locally-based conservation efforts, supporting sustainable recreation, thriving fish and wildlife populations, and vibrant local communities.

Wild Olympics Campaign

To permanently protect 19 Wild and Scenic Rivers and their major tributaries on Washington's Olympic Peninsula representing more than 450 River miles and 126,000 acres of new Wilderness areas that protect key watersheds.

California Wilderness Coalition, Oakland, CA \$50,000



Central Coast and Northwest California Mountains and Rivers Campaigns

To permanently protect more than 321,000 acres of wild lands and 158 miles of rivers in the Los Padres National Forest and the Carrizo Plain National Monument along California's Central Coast, and more than 379,000 acres of wild lands and at least 246 miles of rivers in Northwest California.

Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society, Ottawa, ON \$30,000



Thaidene Nene Project

To permanently protect 7.4 million acres in the proposed Thaidene Nene Protected Area around and beyond the East Arm of Great Slave Lake in Canada's Northwest Territories.

Conservation Lands Foundation, Washington, DC \$50,000



National Monuments Campaign

To secure three new national monuments: Browns Canyon National Monument near Salida, Colorado; Coast Dairies National Monument near Santa Cruz, California; and Birthplace of Rivers National Monument in eastern West Virginia, permanently protecting approximately 150,000 acres that provide unparalleled recreation opportunities within easy reach of the majority of Americans.

Safeguard Utah's Red Rock Country Initiative

To preserve millions of acres of spectacular, wilderness-quality public lands in Utah's red rock country from destructive oil and gas drilling and off-road vehicle use, and to provide crucial time for conservationists to obtain permanent federal protections for these lands.

Boundary Waters Twin Metals Mine Project

To provide lasting protection for the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness from the adverse impacts of large-scale sulfide mining by securing a 20-year mineral withdrawal for public lands within the watershed.

Eastern Utah Public Lands Project

To permanently protect outstanding Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management lands in Eastern Utah as wilderness, exchange certain state lands out of newly protected areas, and secure other special area designations such as mineral withdrawals and/or special management areas for suitable non-wilderness lands.

Greater Yellowstone Coalition, Bozeman, MT \$30,000



Gallatin Range Management Plan Project

To permanently protect outstanding Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management lands in Eastern Utah as wilderness, exchanging certain state lands out of newly protected areas, and secure other special area designations such as mineral withdrawals and/or special management areas for suitable non-wilderness lands.

Kittery Land Trust, Kittery, ME \$30,000



Brave Boat Headwaters Acquisition Campaign

To permanently protect one of the region's most scenic views, critical wildlife habitat, public access to recreational trails and the coast, and provide a keystone "to the Sea" link in the regionally significant Mt. Agamenticus to the Sea Conservation Initiative vision.

Klamath Siskiyou Wildlands Center, Ashland, OR \$25,000



Kalmiopsis Wild Rivers Campaign

To protect Rough and Ready, Baldface and Hunter Creeks from mineral entry, and to obtain Wild and Scenic River designations and expand the Kalmiopsis Wilderness to include their watersheds.

Northern Alaska Environmental Center, Fairbanks, AK \$35,000



Brooks Range Wildland Campaign

To protect 10 million acres of wildlands and rivers flowing from Alaska's Brooks Range to the Yukon River watershed with special designations in BLM's Central Yukon Plan, and eliminate crucial access options for mining and oil and gas that put these world-class rivers, iconic ecosystems and cultural values at risk.

Oregon Natural Desert Association, Bend, OR \$42,188



John Day Wilderness Campaign

To protect ecologically significant Oregon high desert public lands totaling 75,000 acres in the John Day River basin, secure strong support for the protection of an additional 50,000 acres in the basin, and reach agreements with area ranchers to remove grazing from 20,000 acres of public land and protect sensitive fish and wildlife habitat.

Protecting the San Miguel Watershed Project

To permanently protect the San Miguel Watershed and surf spot—one of the last intact watersheds and one of northern Baja's most iconic surf spots—through the creation of Baja California's first state park.

Thompson Divide Coalition, Carbondale, CO \$25,000



Thompson Divide Campaign

To permanently protect Colorado's Thompson Divide from future mineral leasing through legislative or administrative actions; successfully negotiate the sale of valid leases from willing sellers; and, utilize separate Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management NEPA processes to affect the cancellation of illegal leases in the area.

Trust for Public Land, Montpelier, VT \$35,000



Appalachian Trail Corridor Acquisition Project

To permanently protect a one-mile section of the Appalachian Trail and 351 acres of critical forest habitat as an addition to the Green Mountain National Forest in Vermont.

Tuleyome, Woodland, CA \$25,000



Berryessa Snow Mountain Campaign

To permanently protect the 350,000 acres of federal public lands in the Berryessa Snow Mountain region as a National Conservation Area or National Monument.

WaterWatch of Oregon, Portland, OR \$25,000



Fielder and Wimer Dam Removal Campaign

To restore salmon and steelhead access to up to 70 miles of high quality habitat, help recover Endangered Species Act-listed coho salmon, and build on the growing Rogue River recreational river economy by removing two obsolete dams, the fourth and eight worst fish passage barriers in Oregon, from Evans Creek, a major Rogue River tributary in Southern Oregon.

WildSouth, Asheville, NC \$30,000



North Carolina Backcountry Campaign

To increase protection for priority backcountry areas by improving management of recreational resources and preserving backcountry experiences on 200,000 acres of forest and 500 miles of trail on the Pisgah-Nantahala National Forests in Western North Carolina.

Winter Wildlands Alliance, Bosie, ID \$40,000



One Wasatch Project and the Boulder-White Clouds Campaign

To preserve the balance between resort skiing and undeveloped backcountry terrain in Utah's Central Wasatch through permanent protection measures for the lands at risk under the new One Wasatch proposal; and to protect 590,000 acres of pristine winter habitat and backcountry recreation terrain in Idaho's Boulder-White Clouds Mountains through national monument designation.
